WEDDINGS Bauman-Keogh

The wedding has just been solemnised in the rectory of St Patrick's Church, Nashville Tennessee, USA of Miss Monica Keogh a native of Widnes, and daughter of Mrs & Mrs Thomas E Keogh, and James Kenneth Bauman, son of Dr and Mrs J W Bauman. The Rev. John A Murphy officiated.

The reception room of the rectory was decorated with stands of pink and white gladioli. The improvised alter of palms and ferns was centred with a tall standard of the flowers, flanked on either side by ivory tapers burning in a seven branched candelabra.

A programme of nuptial music was given by Mrs Joseph Otto and John Dowd, vocalists, and Mrs Patrick Casey, piano.

Mr Keogh gave his daughter in marriage, and her only attendant was Miss Mary Ann Kleiser. Mr William H Eaton served as Mr Bauman's best man.

The bride was lovely in her wedding gown of white satin, fashioned along princess lines, and worn with a jacket of lace. The sleeves of the jacket were puffed to the elbow and fitted to the wrist. An Elizabethan collar finished the neckline, and the lace train, attached to the waistline, fell over the satin train of the gown. The veil of white tulle was caught to the hair with a cap of the lace with orange blossoms. She carried a cascade bouquet of bride's roses and lilies of the valley.

Miss Kleiser wore a gown of pale pink satin with mitts of pink lace. She wore a coronet of brilliants, and carried an arm bouquet of Joanna Hill Roses.

Mr and Mrs Keogh, the bride's parents, entertained at a reception at their home on Second Avenue South.

Mrs Keogh wore a gown of brown crepe trimmed with bands of brown fur, and her flowers were Talisman roses. Mrs Bauman's gown was of navy blue crepe and her flowers were gardenias.

Mrs and Mrs Kenneth Bauman afterwards left for a Southern motor trip. Mrs Bauman wore an ensemble of midnight blue crepe with a collar and cuffs of white satin. She wore a matching hat and accessories.
